PETALING JAYA: The Kempinski Hotel Kuala Lumpur, which makes up part of the RM5.4bil 8 Conlay project developed by KSK group Bhd, will create 700 new jobs when the hotel is open for business in 2020.

KSK has partnered with Switzerland's Kempinski Hotels to open up Kempinski Hotel Kuala Lumpur, a part of 8 Conlay development.

Kempinski Hotel Kuala Lumpur is expected to provide 260 five-star hotel rooms and 300 serviced suites in a 68-story tower, and is a part of 8 Conlay's mixed-use development.
